Indoor 2024/25 Program Handbook

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Introduction

Purpose

The goal of this handbook is to support CMSA clubs in preparation for and throughout the registration process, as well as guide parents/caregivers when choosing a program for their youth athlete(s). This handbook includes important information such as the CMSA Program Calendar and League Structure, key messaging, and program goals across CMSA's programming to assist clubs in marketing and communicating the CMSA league offerings to parents and families.

Language and Terminology

Language determines the culture we operate in, and if we want to develop an accessible and inclusive sport culture in Calgary, an emphasis on using appropriate language is key. We all play a role in promoting a consistent message to participants and families about the benefits of each competition model.

CMSA leagues and programming operate in a grassroots-sporting environment and there are no elite players or teams. Elite players are found on youth national teams and full-time professional programs. We currently do not operate in any of those environments or programs. Member clubs should avoid using words such as elite, premier, select, etc. in communications and program marketing.

Team Entry

Teams are entered before the CMSA Team Entry Deadline. Clubs can review tiering with CMSA before the group format schedules are produced. In December, there will be an opportunity to facilitate team swaps between divisions should teams be misplaced. These details will be provided directly to the clubs.

CMSA Grassroots League U7 – U9

Goals of the CMSA Grassroots League

CMSA's Grassroots League is modelled after national and international best practices and <u>Canada Soccer Grassroots Standards</u>. The league strives to provide children with a developmentally appropriate playing environment that allows expression, creativity, and development to flourish. Match Day provides players with more time on the field, more time on the ball, and flexible matchups through an open roster system.

This league encourages mixed-ability (balanced) groupings prioritizing social relationships as the basis of Match Day groups. This allows players to move between groups as required to ensure that each participant has a positive and developmentally appropriate match environment. The CMSA Grassroots League prioritizes enjoyment, so players want to come back next week and more importantly, for many seasons to come!

CMSA's U10 and U11 League

About the Developmental Plus+ and Developmental Programming

CMSA's U10 and U11 League has a 'Developmental Plus+' and 'Developmental' stream. Both streams offer a quality experience for players and their families. Neither stream is purely based on ability but on the needs, interests, and motivations of the child. The determining factors in evaluating whether to place groups in the "Developmental Plus+" or "Developmental" streams are the length of the season and the proximity of their matches. "Developmental Plus+" will play in a city-wide. "Developmental" will have regionalized play. In this player-first model, clubs are encouraged to evaluate players based on their levels of interest and commitment in soccer and utilize social relationships (friendships) as a key factor in forming teams. CMSA advocates for equal playing time for all players and to try all positions on the pitch. No scores or standings are kept in the Developmental Plus+ or Developmental stream.

Development Plus+ Stream

This stream is appropriate for players and families interested in:



Soccer as their primary activity

For players who LOVE soccer, are very interested & likely to participate year-round



Longer Season, City-Wide

For players looking for a longer season and are comfortable with city-wide play



More activity each week

For players looking for increased play/training opportunities within their club environment

Development Stream

This stream is appropriate for players and families interested in:



A variety of sports or activities

For players who may be multi-sport, have a variety of different interests/ commitments, looking for 'part-time soccer'



Shorter Season, Quadrant-based

For players looking for a shorter season and want games closer to home

Goals of the U12 and U13 League

CMSA's league offering for the U12, and U13 League aims to have quality programming for youth at all ages, stages of development, and interest/commitment levels. CMSA welcomes experienced and novice players into any of our clubs to continue or begin their soccer journey. Our U12 and U13 leagues operate in alignment with Long-Term Player Development (LTPD) Standards and would be a part of Stage 3 – Learn to Train (U12) and Stage 7 – Soccer for Life (U13 – Community and Competitive).

CMSA advocates for equitable playing time for all players regardless of Tier in these ages. A balance of skill level and commitment should be considered when tiering players. CMSA recommends the following considerations to ensure that players and families are placed in the appropriate program:

Tier I and Tier II Considerations



More developed players

For players who are more developed and experienced in the game of soccer



Year-round soccer participation

For players who are more likely to play year-round and/or have soccer as their primary activity



Increased weekly commitment*

For families committed to 3 or more soccer activities each week (training and a match)

Alberta Player Development League (APDL)

About the Alberta Player Development League (APDL)

The <u>Alberta Player Development League (APDL)</u> is the Alberta Player Development Program (PDP). The PDP is Canada Soccer's standards-based youth training and competition framework. It provides an environment (both in training and competition) to allow for high-quality organizations to contribute to the ongoing development of players, coaches, officials, and administrators.

The APDL is part of a national network of licensed clubs and standards-based competitions which will foster player and coach development in Canada.

The APDL is for players in the Train-to-Train stage of their development or Stage 4 of Long-Term Player Development (LTPD).

League standards for coaching are higher than local district leagues (Tier I - Tier V) with APDL head coaches needing to be enrolled or have attained their Youth License. All APDL Assistant Coaches must hold a C License.


Format and Key Dates

Minimum Coaching Standards



- Required for all team officials (coaches, assistant coaches, team managers)
- Required education for coaches and assistant coaches
- Recommended coach training

Team Naming Criteria

Team Entry Naming

CMSA has implemented Team Naming Criteria for clubs to name their teams when entering the league. This criterion will allow CMSA to accurately keep track of teams throughout the season and to help differentiate teams with similar or same names.

If your team's name does not comply with the below criteria, CMSA will change your team's name to display on the CMSA website to fit the criteria.

Criteria

- 1. Club Name
 - a. Full name or acronym is acceptable
- 2. Team Name
 - a. Must have at least more than 3 characters differentiating it from other teams in your club
 - b. Male and female teams cannot share the same name
 - c. Fun, creative names are encouraged, but not required
- 3. Birth Year
 - a. In the format "06"
 - b. This is to assist with divisions in multi-year age groups
 - c. Use the oldest birth year that players are born in

Acceptable Name Examples

- ✓ EMFC United 08
- Calgary RangersAthletics
- ☑ 07 CMSA Unicorns 13

Unacceptable Name Examples

- NWU FC this is acceptable for 1 team, but not all team names in your club
- NSD B17 C this age group changes yearly, a birth year does not
- CMSA FC 06 & CMSA SC 06 more than three letters need to be different to avoid confusion
